

## **BLOCKAGES**



In accordance with your tenancy agreement, the tenant is initially responsible for unblocking kitchen sinks, bathroom basins, baths, toilets and drains.

- If your efforts are unsuccessful, then please contact the Delta Office for assistance.
- Should our Team be unable to clear the blockage using basic equipment, then we will refer it back to the Council on your behalf.

NOTE: We no longer use the OneShot product to clear a blockage





## PLEASE DON'T BE A NOISY NEIGHBOUR

In the HOT weather, residents are keeping windows and doors open for increased air flow. Please keep your music, TV, radio volume down. This also applies to in-car music systems.

We appreciate you will all have something to celebrate at some stage during the year, but ask you to please keep your parties/noise/drunken chatter down – so as not to disturb your neighbours!

Can we also please ask, that residents are <u>NOT</u> greeted with a barrage of abuse, when politely asking for the noise to be lowered.

Remember there are elderly folk and young children in all the blocks, who like/need an afternoon nap or an early night!

#### IN ACCORDANCE WITH YOUR TENANCY AGREEMENT

Any noise related building works or DIY should only be carried out between 8am and 6pm Mon-Fri and between 8am and 1pm on a Saturday

NO WORKS should be carried out on a Sunday!

You should also avoid using domestic appliances like washing machines, vacuum cleaners etc before 7am or after 10pm

Whether you are at home or not, we also ask all dog owners and/or dog sitters, to stop their animal/s from yapping/growling/barking/howling.

It has become a real issue for neighbours and those living locally and within earshot.

However, we must appreciate that illness and germs can strike at any time, so cancellations can't always be helped.



## **BRITISH GAS SCAM**



The local Safer Neighbourhood Team advise that residents are receiving emails claiming to be from British Gas, offering a refund.

These emails are bogus - there is **NO REFUND!** And the links take you to cloned websites designed to steal your British Gas login details.

Action Fraud is the UK's national reporting centre for fraud and cyber crime where you should report fraud if you have been scammed, defrauded or experienced cyber crime.

## UNIVERSAL CREDIT ... are you ready?

Universal Credit is a benefit for people of working age. It combines support for adults, children and housing costs into one benefit. Universal Credit is paid monthly in arrears instead of fortnightly or weekly and is replacing:

- Housing benefit
- Working tax credit
- Child tax credit
- Income support
- Income based Jobseekers Allowance
- Income-related Employment and support Allowance.

Universal Credit full services began in Havering in June 2018. Most people who need to make a new claim for the above benefits, or those who are already claiming but have a change of circumstances, will need to claim Universal Credit

A person will need to make a claim for Universal Credit if they:

- Are of working age
- Are working but on a low income
- Are not working but are able and available for work
- Currently have limited capability for work related to a disability or health condition but this is expected to change over time
- Have a disability or health condition that prevents them from working
- Care for a severely disabled person for a least 35 hours per week
- Have 2 or less children and are the lead carer for them
- Live in a property that they are renting or are a leaseholder who has service charges
- Need to make a new claim for benefits or are already claiming benefits but has a change of circumstances.

#### Will I get help with my rent if I get Universal Credit?

You must claim for help with your rent when you make your claim for Universal Credit. Your rent costs will be paid directly to you as part of your monthly Universal Credit payment and you will be responsible for paying your rent ut of that money.

If you are a Havering Council tenant you will need to arrange a Direct Debit with Havering Services or a standing order with your bank to pay your rent.

### What about help with my Council Tax?

If you have applied for or are in receipt of Universal Credit and are liable for Council Tax you must make a separate application for Council Tax support online.

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#### What do I need t do to make sure I am prepared?

Access to the internet: Universal Credit is claimed and managed online. There is no paper form and everything is always done online

A bank account: You will need a transactional bank account in order to receive your Universal Credit. There is further information on bank accounts for benefit payments on the money advise service website.

Payment and budgeting skills: Universal Credit is only paid monthly, so you must make sure you budget your money so that it lasts your household for the whole month. The welfare reform team can give you advice or you can find inline budgeting tools on the money advice service website.

**Rent - Direct Debit or Standing Order:** Universal Credit pays your housing costs (rent) directly to you as part of your Universal Credit which means you are responsible for paying that money to your landlord. Setting up a direct debit or standing order to pay your rent is the best way to make sure it is paid on time.

#### Pay your Council housing rent by Direct Debit

Be aware of sanctions: When you claim Universal Credit you will have to make a claimant commitment. Part of this means you will be put in a group with set activities. If you do not do the activities you will be sanctioned. This means your benefit will be temporarily reduced so you must make sure you do what you have agreed in order to receive your money.

As this letter was sent to Delta TMO anonymously, we can only reply to the sender via our newsletter ... in the hope our response will be read.

We *are* aware of the vehicle in question, and agree that it does take up space that could be used for car parking. A vehicle must be parked legally, be both taxed and insured and not exceed 7.5 tonnes; in this instance, the criteria has been met and we can do nothing about it.

We would also like to point out, that parking issues/traffic enforcement is not under the Delta TMO jurisdiction. May we suggest you contact the Local Authority Traffic Enforcement Officers (traffic wardens) with your grievance.
